Fit for The Future – NW SAS Virtual Conference 2021

Our first virtual full day SAS conference was held on 4th March 2021, with approximately 100 attendees joining the meeting via Microsoft Teams. There was a range of plenary sessions and workshops, with very positive feedback. Sessions included:

There were high quality oral and poster presentations from submitted abstracts, as well as a very moving reflection on a SAS doctor's experiences during the Covid-19 pandemic.

Despite a few technical challenges, the event was a great success overall, with the vast majority of delegates evaluating the sessions as Excellent or Good.

We are already beginning to plan for our 2022 Conference and will take on board the suggestions made in the feedback from this year's conference.

SAS Awards

Edge Hill University Postgraduate Certificate in Workplace-Based Postgraduate Medical Education

We are pleased to report that 66 SAS doctors and dentists have now commenced a Postgraduate Certificate in Workplace-Based Postgraduate Medical Education at Edge Hill University, funded through the SAS Development Fund. A few of those who were allocated places for the 2020/21 academic year have needed to defer their start dates for various reasons and will hopefully commence the course in September 2021 instead.

Mind Tools

We have purchased 200 licences for SAS doctors to access Mind Tools. Mind Tools is a suite of management, leadership & personal effectiveness online modules, and further information is available at <https://www.mindtools.com/>.

Most of the licences have been allocated via the trusts who signed up for them, but there are a few available on a first-come-first-served basis for anyone else who would like to access them. Please email sasdoctors.nw@hee.nhs.uk if you would like the details of how to register for a licence.

Each licence cost £50, so although they are being provided free of charge, we would ask that you only register for one if you will be able to use it regularly. Most of the modules are very short (10 minutes or less) so can be completed in short sessions when you have a few minutes spare.
